Concrete Masonry Association of California and Nevada (CMACN), a non-profit organization, is pleased to announce our scholarships for California and Nevada students who will be continuing at a California or Nevada university the following fall semester and have **ALREADY** successfully engaged in and contributed to the concrete masonry block industry during their college experience through employment, a cooperative work experience, or internship with a California or Nevada masonry contractor or one of CMACN's Producer Member companies (found on the CMACN website at <http://cmacn.org/producer-members.htm>). **For more information about CMACN scholarships, visit www.cmacn.org. As an association of concrete masonry block manufacturers, CMACN's mission is to strengthen the masonry industry in California and Nevada by providing technical information resources on concrete masonry for design professionals, protect and advance the interests of the concrete masonry industry, develop new and existing markets for concrete masonry products, and coordinate our members' efforts in solving common problems within the masonry industry.

CMACN develops, monitors, and coordinates test programs, research projects, and specification updates. We publish technical and educational data, and both receive and disseminate recommendations for improved product use. To this end, we have implemented a scholarship program in order to promote the study of concrete masonry as a subject in California and Nevada. Specifically, the Legacy Memorial Scholarship was established in memory of preceding CMACN Presidents who have since passed away. The recipient of the scholarship will receive \$4,000 to be used towards tuition and educational materials. **Only one student will be awarded the Legacy Memorial Scholarship per calendar year.**

Requests for this scholarship should be submitted via email, USPS mail, or fax on the attached application and include a signed, dated, and sealed departmental recommendation **AND** a signed, dated, and sealed recommendation from the direct supervisor at the place of industry experience. Emailed and faxed letters of recommendation will only be accepted from the recommenders, NOT from the applicant. Additionally, the scholarship recipient must be committed to continuing at their stated California or Nevada university the following semester.

To be considered for a scholarship, applications must be postmarked no later than 11:59 pm, Tuesday, September 3, 2024. Repeat applicants and previous awardees are welcome to apply. All scholarship applicants will be notified of their award status approximately two months after the scholarship application closure date. Letter providing university faculty members and industry supervisors will be notified only if the recommended student is selected for a scholarship. **Applications suspected of AI answers or utilizing answers previously submitted will be disqualified.** Please call or email if you have questions.
